Jena Nelson Announces Candidacy for Congress

Civic Leader and Award-Winning Educator Ready to Fight for CD-5 Families

OKLAHOMA CITY, OK - Ready to face off against do-nothing leadership in a fight for Oklahoma’s future, Jena Nelson is announcing her candidacy for Congressional District 5 (CD-5). The civic leader, former small business owner and educator is focused on restoring good government, strengthening the middle class and protecting Social Security and Medicare.

“Between skyrocketing grocery costs, the highest insurance rates in the nation and non-stop housing expense growth, it’s simply too expensive for everyday Oklahomans to live right now,” Nelson said. “But while working families struggle, Stephanie Bice and the other MAGA Minions in D.C. are solely focused on helping billionaires get richer. That’s not OK.”

Jena is a nonprofit development professional, corporate leadership developer and small business owner who most recently served as acting Executive Director and Director of Programs for the Oklahoma Faith Network. She has been happily married to her husband Karl, a university professor and church choir director, for 21 years. They are proud parents of two children.

In addition to addressing Oklahoma’s affordability crisis, Jena is running to protect Veterans’ healthcare, strengthen national security and save programs that are lifelines for vulnerable Oklahomans, like Social Security, Medicare and Medicaid.

“Almost half of the children born in Oklahoma depend on Medicaid and we just witnessed our elected officials throw their hands up and vote to gut essential services for the most vulnerable among us,” Nelson said. “It’s incredible to drive down I-35 and see billboards bought by billionaires thanking them for this decision. It’s time to hold leaders like Stephanie Bice accountable for their actions - this moral malignancy has to end.”

Prior to her work in the nonprofit and corporate realms, Jena was an educator for more than 16 years, winning Oklahoma Teacher of the Year in 2020. She helped her students earn over \$4 million in scholarships. Mrs. Nelson was selected to direct at the prestigious Edinburgh Fringe Festival in Scotland and as a presenter at the International Music Festival in Campina Grande Brazil. In 2022, Jena ran for State Superintendent of Public Instruction and earned more statewide votes than any other Democrat. “When I ran for State Superintendent in 2022, I told the truth about Ryan Walters and what he would do to our children, our communities and our families. I did not lie, and now I’m sharing the truth about what Stephanie Bice has done to our state,” Nelson said. “While the political machine thought they silenced us, they were wrong. Because here’s what they don’t understand: When you attack Oklahomans, we fight back. This isn’t just about an election - it’s about the very soul of Oklahoma and the heart of democracy.”

New AARP Survey: Confidence In Social Security Among Younger Adults Hits 15-Year Low

Ahead of Social Security’s 90th anniversary, AARP has released a new report showing a sharp decline in Americans’ confidence in the program’s future—especially among younger adults. Just 25% of adults ages 18–49 express confidence in Social Security, compared to 48% of those 50 and older. Overall confidence has dropped 7 percentage points since 2020. The report also highlights the growing reliance on Social Security, with more than 82 million Americans projected to depend on the program by 2035—13 million more than today. In Oklahoma, more than 838,000 residents count on Social Security. For 43% of them (262,494 people), it makes up at least half of their income. For 22% (135,460 people), it provides 90% or more of their income. Additional findings show: 96% of Americans say Social Security is important. 78% worry it won’t provide enough to live on in retirement. 67% believe it’s more important to retirees now than five years ago.
